



University of Sheffield by numbers

In 1904, over £50,000 was raised by penny donations from local steel factory workers and residents to help found the University – that's over £15 million in today's money.

<u> 1905</u>

The University was founded, with just 114 students. King Edward VII opened Firth Court the same year.

<u>1908</u>

The first graduation took place, with 81 students attending the ceremony in Firth Court.

1.3million

Books and periodicals in the University libraries.

1,000

More than 1,000 graduates have given their time to support over 8,000 students as Alumni Volunteers.

6 Nobel Laureates

In 2016, former lecturer, Professor Sir J Fraser Stoddart was awarded the Nobel Prize for Chemistry, making him the University's sixth Nobel Prize winner.

10 years +

Our Students' Union has been voted the best in the country for more than a decade.

£98 million

More than 65,000 individual gifts have been donated to the University since 2002, totalling more than £98 million in philanthropic income received.
