

Important information about your programme of study

We are planning several changes to the Dental Surgery programme for 2027 entry and beyond. If you are planning to start your Dental Surgery programme in 2026, it is possible that these changes may impact your studies.

If you start your degree in 2026 and later find yourself in a position where you need to repeat a year of the course or take a leave of absence, it is likely that the year you are repeating or starting later will have a different structure and content from your original programme of study. This may mean that you also have to repeat all or parts of earlier years or cover new content, to ensure you have covered all of the pre-requisite material for the updated version of the course you will be enrolled on.

Should you face any difficulties during your studies, we will make every effort to enable you to remain on the version of the programme you started, to ensure you have the best possible student experience. You will have opportunities to repeat assessments within the same year of study, and we can provide appropriate support to help you overcome any barriers you may face.
