Johnson on Ethiopia

R. SAMUEL JOHNSON, lexicographer, Dimoralist, and talker, is regarded as a man's man. 'I believe,' he once said, 'marriages would in general be as happy, and often more so, if they were all made by the Lord Chancellor upon a due consideration of characters and circumstances without the parties having any choice in the matter.' Although this hardly suggests the heady romantic, Johnson was none the less a writer of fertile imagination and energy. The Third Programme on Monday presents an adaptation from one of his lesser-



known works A History of Rasselas, Prince of Abyssinia, which Johnson sat down and wrote in a week. It will be partly in dramatised form, with characters reading their own speeches straight from the book, two narrators, and authentic Abyssinian background effects. The charm of this work, which consists mainly of dissertations strung on a slender thread of story, lies in its wisdom and humanity.


