
to cycling at the University of Sheffield




About this map

CURRENTLY CYCLE TO CAMPUS

Need some help uphill or through traffic?

Sheffield is a vibrant city said to be built on 7 hills, this means traffic and some uphill cycling.


If you're not used to cycling, don't let it put you off. Pedal Ready are a local cooperative of qualified cycle instructors who currently offer pre-bookable Learn to Ride sessions at Stephenson Hall, Endcliffe Residences, on Tuesdays (5pm - 8pm) and Saturdays (9am - 12noon). Free 1-2-1 cycle training is also available to suit you upon request, just contact **0114 2412775** or visit **www.pedalready.co.uk** for more details.

Remember!

To obey the rules of the Highway Code and be courteous to other road users. A bike with gears will help you get up those hills! You don't have to wear a helmet but it is a good idea.

The good news is, what goes up has to come down!

Get a bike



OK, so you've arrived at Sheffield and you want to start cycling but you've got no ride, what can you do?

Student Bike Sale:

The University holds a refurbished bike sale once a year. All the bikes are fully restored by the good people at ReCycle Bikes. The sales are really popular so watch out for the date announcement and get there early.

Bring Your Bike from Home:

Unless you're training for the Tour de Yorkshire, chances are you'll need to arrange transport to get your bike here. If you're bringing your bike by train, check with the rail company you'll be travelling with, some need pre-booking.

Bike Shop:

There are plenty of bike shops in Sheffield and then there are always second hand ads. If you are buying second hand, try and find someone to go with you when you go to view/collect.

Lock it, don't lose it

You've got your wheels, the last thing you want is to come out of lectures and find they're not where you left them...

Get a good lock

Spend 10% of the value of the bike on locking it up. Trying to save a few quid on a lock might cost you a lot more in the long run. Look out for special offers on campus on locks and security tagging. If you get a nice new bike remember the lock off your old rusty ride might not be up to the job.

There are over 2500 cycle parking spaces on campus, see our map online; lock your bike to one of them, even if you're just popping in and out of a building.





Brakes wear down, gears need adjusting, punctures happen.

Any vehicle needs servicing, bikes included. There's a DIY public workstand and tools at the Endcliffe Village to help you with any running repairs or alternatively drop your bike in to the University's Cycle Hut.

The Cycle Hut provides free safety checks and great value servicing and repairs, by a team of expert mechanics. The staff are really friendly and will do what they can to help and offer advice:
