

# Using Read & Write with eBooks

## Instructions for VLeBooks, ProQuest eBook Central (Read Online)

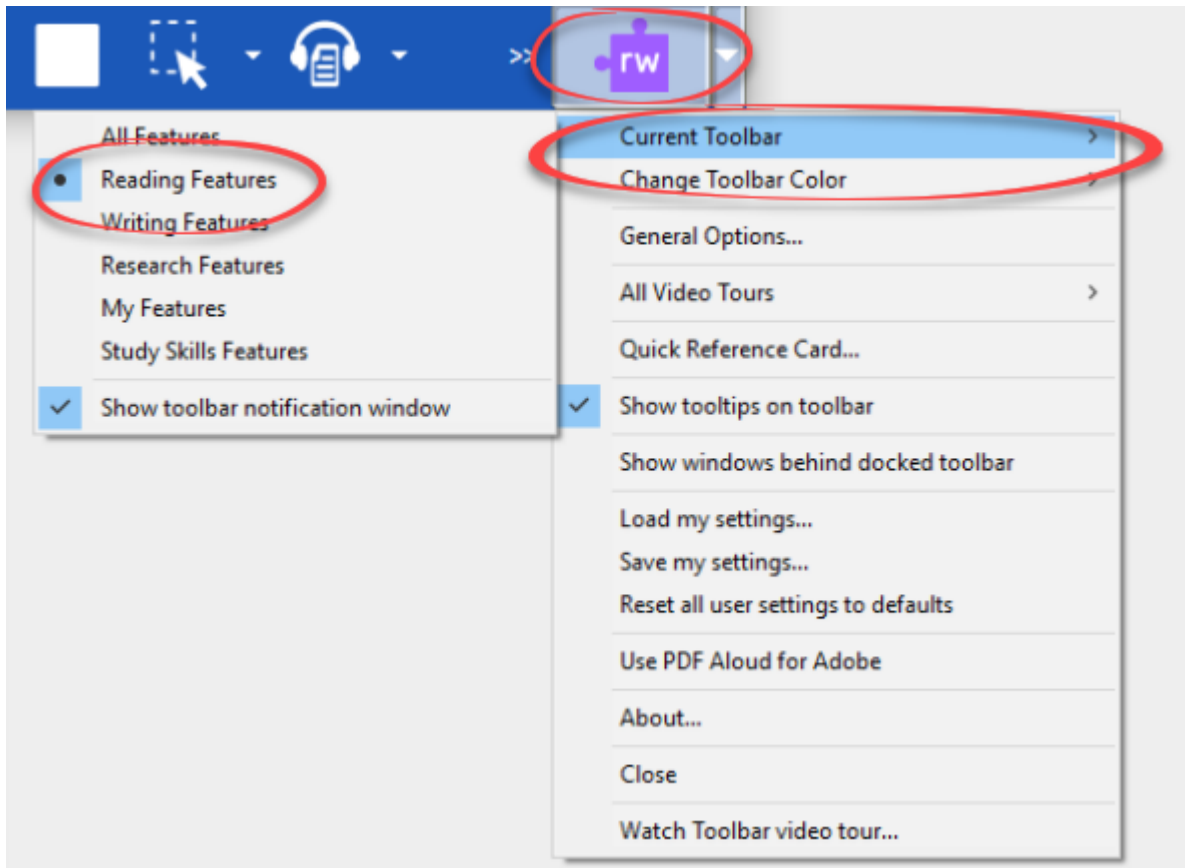
- Open the ebook you would like to be read to you. Select 'Read Online' and navigate to the page/chapter you would like to be read aloud.
- Open Read & Write from the start menu (or download from the software centre).



- The Read and Write toolbar should appear on the screen.



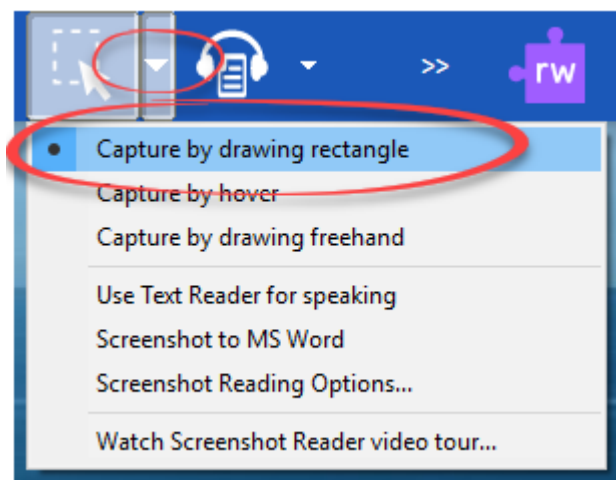
- Make sure you are in the 'Reading Features' Read & Write toolbar by clicking on the drop down arrow next to the 'rw' symbol on the right hand side, hover over Current Toolbar and select Reading Features.



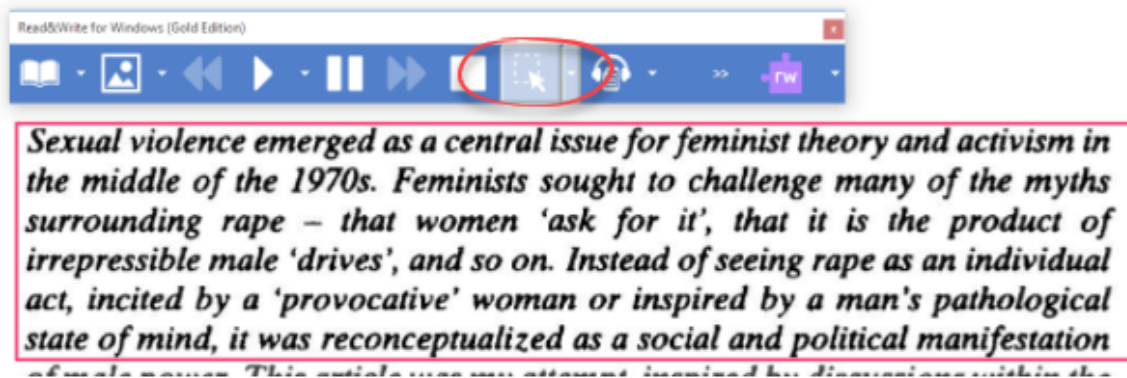
- On the Read & Write toolbar, select the Screenshot Reader icon.



- Click on the drop down arrow next to it and select 'Capture by drawing rectangle'



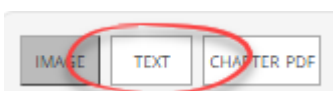
- Select the Screenshot reader icon and then use the cursor to draw a rectangle around the text you want to be read aloud. It should now be read aloud automatically. You can do this repeatedly.



## Instructions for ACLS Humanity

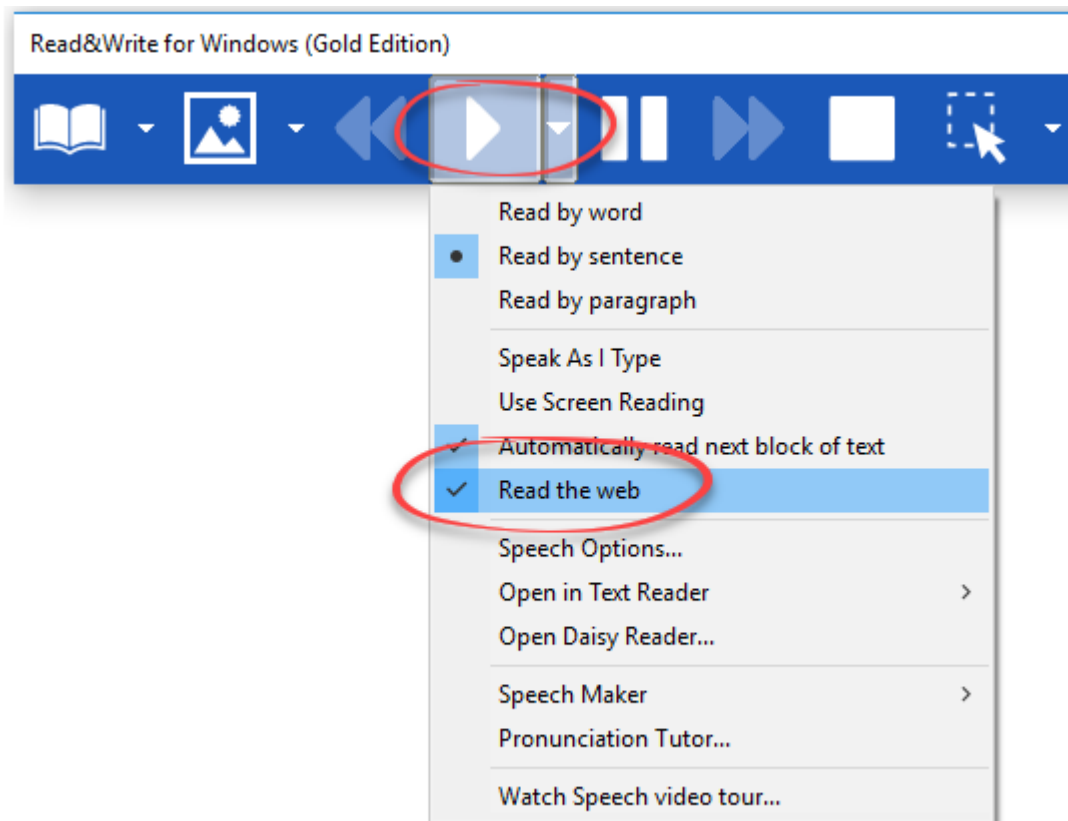
You can use the above instructions or alternatively you can:

- Open Read & Write from the start menu (or download from the software centre).
- Select 'Read Online' and make sure you are in the 'Reading Features' toolbar by clicking on the drop down arrow next to the 'rw' symbol on the right hand side, hover over Current Toolbar and select Reading Features.
- Select 'text' to change the eBook from image to text.

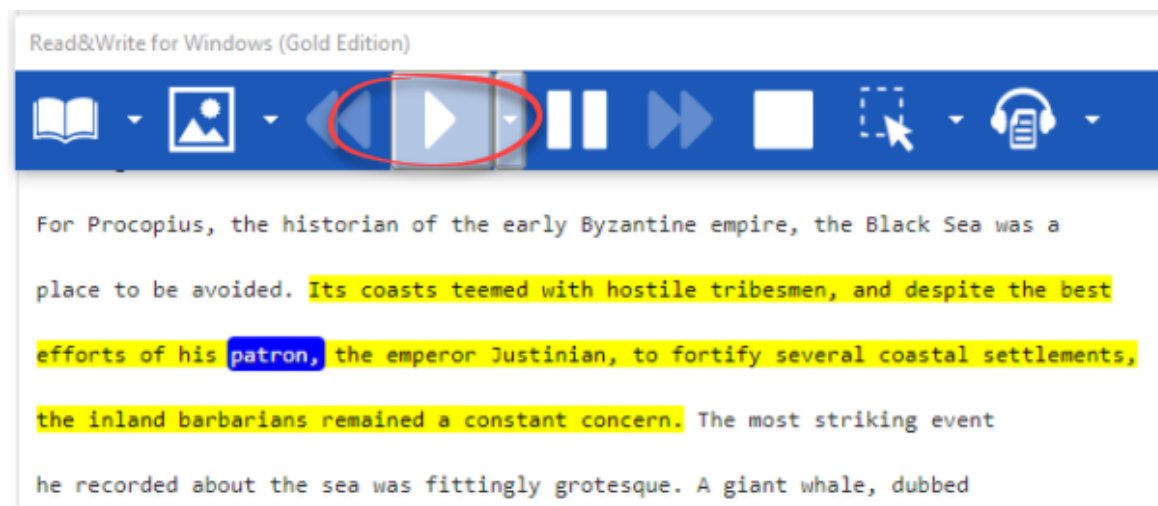


- Select the arrow next to the 'Play' icon and select 'Read the web'.





- Hover over the piece of text you would like to be read aloud until it is highlighted.



## Instructions for Adobe Digital Editions

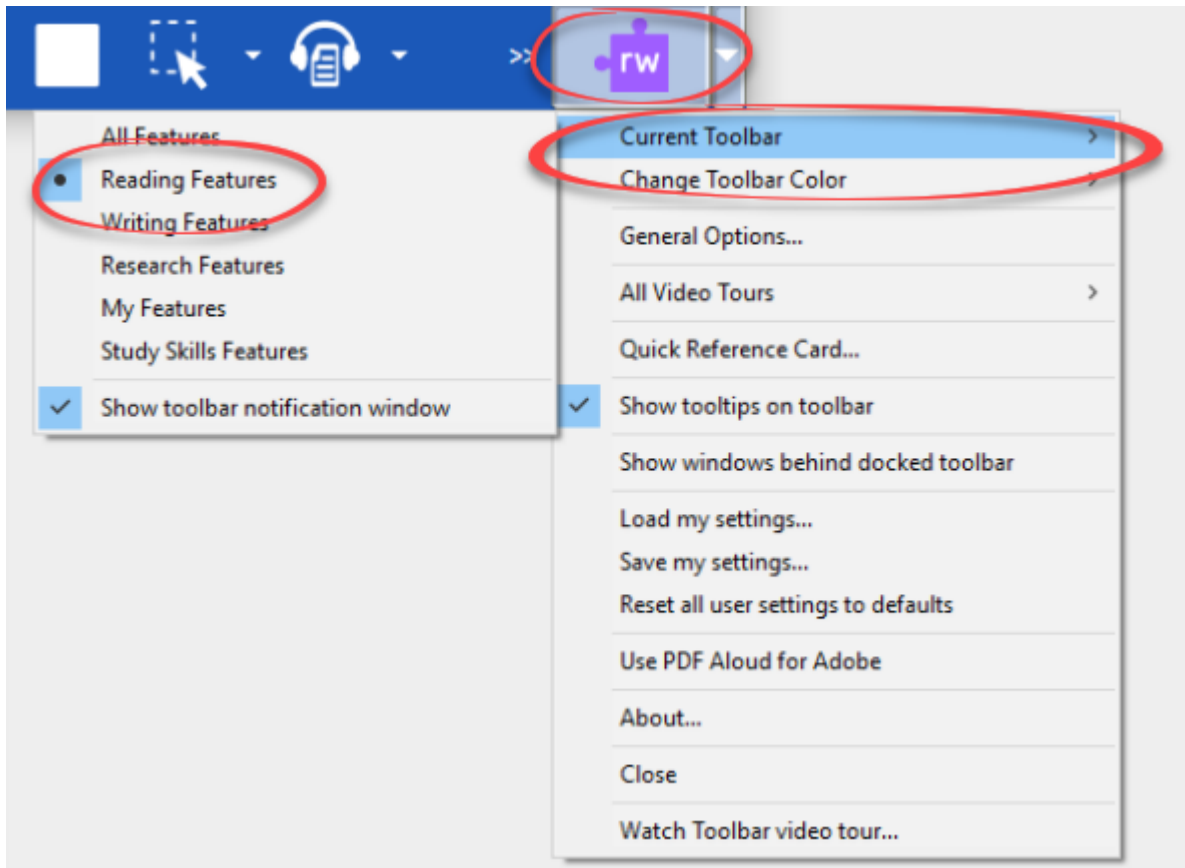
- Download the eBook or open a previously downloaded ebook from Adobe Digital Editions in the start menu.
- Open Read & Write from the start menu (or download from the software centre).



- The Read and Write toolbar should appear on the screen.



- Make sure you are in the 'Reading Features' Read & Write toolbar by clicking on the drop down arrow next to the 'rw' symbol on the right hand side, hover over Current Toolbar and select Reading Features.



On the Read & Write toolbar,select the Screenshot Reader icon.



Click on the drop down arrow next to it and select 'Capture by drawing rectangle'
