

Apply as a child

As you are under 21, you can choose how to apply.

If your parent or guardian has settled status

You can apply to get the same status as your parent or guardian if they are either:

- an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen – this includes Irish citizens and a person of Northern Ireland
- the spouse or civil partner of an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, or a person of Northern Ireland

Check which countries are in the [European Economic Area \(EEA\)](#).

Your parent or guardian must also be one of the following:

- a person with settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme
- an Irish citizen who would get settled status if they applied
- a person of Northern Ireland who would get settled status if they could apply

If your parent or guardian does not have settled status

You will need to apply based on how long you have been living in the UK.

We may ask you for [proof of how long you have lived in the UK](#) (also called 'residence evidence').

What status you can apply for

The status you can apply for normally depends on how long you have been living in the UK.

We will tell you the status you can apply for and, in some cases, we may ask you to upload some evidence.

You can then submit your application.

Apply for pre-settled status

If you have been continuously resident in the UK for less than 5 years, you can apply for pre-settled status.

If you get pre-settled status you can stay in the UK for a further 5 years. When you have been continuously resident for 5 years you can apply for settled status.

[I think I am eligible for settled status](#)

We need evidence of your residence in the UK

We have not been able to find tax or benefits history that confirms your residence in the UK. This may be because there are gaps in our records or we may not be able to match our records to the information you have given.

What you need to do

To apply for pre-settled status you will need to upload evidence that you were in the UK for at least one day before 31st December 2020. The last day you were in the UK cannot be more than 6 months ago.
