## A Hard Journey (Uhambo Olunzima)





## Dora got on the bus and the bus left.


On the bus, she thinks of her parents and children that she left behind.







Mhmmm...She arrives in Pretoria, where her friends welcome her. Her friends are the ones who fetched her and she stayed with them for a while.




